SEMINAR'S TOPIC

The subject area of the seminar is "Social and economic aspects of legal institutions". That means, you are going to analyse how legal rules function and operate in society: how law regulates economy, civil society, and human behaviour, and how social and economic practices (civil society, social movements, market players etc.) affect legal rules and practices.

RULES FOR REGISTRATION
