<p>28.10.2016</p>	<p><u>Paper: Case Analysis</u></p> <p>Each group member is obliged to prepare a paper that will include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) Prayer for Relief b) Facts relevant to the case c) Ambiguous facts d) Research questions (legal questions that should be addressed, in the context of a particular prayer for relief) <p>Each student will present its paper that will be subject to discussion.</p> <p>Deadline for sending: 27th October (maja.zajac@prawo.uni.wroc.pl)</p>
<p>25.11.2016</p>	<p><u>Paper: Draft Pleadings</u></p> <p>Each group is obliged to submit Draft Pleadings for both Applicant and Respondent. The draft should present the line of legal argumentation, referring to facts and law.</p> <p>Example:</p> <p><i>“I. Raglan is Responsible Under International Law for the Attack and the Wreck of The Mairi Maru.</i></p> <p><i>A. Raglan has breached its obligations under international law to suppress and prevent piracy</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <i>1. Thomas Good’s acts of violence fall within the definition of piracy</i> <i>2. Raglan failed to fulfill its obligations under international law because it failed to suppress piracy in its archipelagic waters and failed to properly respond to the attack on The Mairi Maru</i> <p><i>B. Raglan is responsible for the attack on and wreck of The Mairi Maru because Raglan failed to respond appropriately to the pirate attacks in violation of its obligations under international law</i></p> <p><i>C. Raglan is responsible for the attack upon and wreck of The Mairi Maru because Thomas Good’s acts are attributable to Raglan”</i></p>
<p>2.12 & 9.12.2016</p>	<p><u>Trail oral argumentation</u></p> <p>Each student is obliged to prepare and present an oral argumentation (on the basis of Draft Pleadings). Oral argumentation will be limited to chosen prayer for relief, however from the perspective of Applicant and Respondent (firstly, the argumentation for Applicant, secondly, for Respondent). During presentation students are entitled to ask questions (in order to simulate the actual proceeding).</p>
<p>16.12.2016</p>	<p><u>Deadline for Memorials Submission</u></p> <p>Each group is obliged to submit the Memorial for Applicant and the Memorial for Respondent</p>
<p>End of December 2016 & January 2017</p>	<p><u>Oral argumentation</u> - each group member is obliged to argue before the bench. Bench will be formed by students.. Judges are entitled to ask questions about facts of the case and law. Groups consisting of 2-3 members are obliged to argue on behalf of both Applicant and Respondent.</p>
